POLICY 182 TRUSTEE PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

Orientation and Onboarding

The Board believes orientation and onboarding programs are necessary for effective trusteeship. Key topics include:

- Role of the trustee, the corporate Board, Superintendent and Secretary Treasurer;
- Trustee code of conduct and conflict of interest;
- Organizational structures ;
- Board policy, by-laws, and meetings;
- Existing District initiatives, annual reports, budgets, financial statements, and long-range plans;
- District programs and services;
- Board's function as an appeal body; and
- statutory and regulatory requirements.

Financial support is available for trustees to attend British Columbia School Trustees' Association sponsored orientation academy. The Board Chair, Superintendent and Secretary Treasurer are responsible for developing and implementing the orientation and onboarding programs.

Professional Learning

The Board encourages the participation of trustees at appropriate conferences, workshops and conventions, recognizing the need for, and the value in, provincial professional learning opportunities available to trustees.
